## **ACCREDITATION TEAM INVITES PUBLIC COMMENTS ABOUT JUNO BEACH POLICE DEPARTMENT**

Juno Beach: A team of assessors from the Commission for Florida Law Enforcement Accreditation (CFA) will arrive December 2nd, 2025 to examine all aspects of the Juno Beach Police Department's policies and procedures, management, operations, and support services. The Juno Beach Police Department has to comply with numerous standards in order to receive reaccredited status. Many of the standards are critical to life, health, safety issues, and best practices.

As part of this assessment, agency members and the general public are invited to offer comments to the assessment team. A copy of the standards manual is available on the CFA website at [www.flaccreditation.org](http://www.flaccreditation.org) under the standards tab.

The accreditation program manager for the Juno Beach Police Department is Police Services Coordinator Allyson Lynch. She said the assessment team is composed of assessors from similar agencies. The assessors will review written materials, interview individuals, and visit offices and other areas where compliance can be observed.

Once the Commission's assessors complete their review of the agency, they report to the full Commission, which then determines if the agency is to receive reaccredited status. The Juno Beach Police Department's accreditation is valid for three years. Verification by the team that the Juno Beach Police Department meets the Commission's standards is part of a voluntary process to gain or maintain accreditation -- a highly prized recognition of professional excellence, according to Chief Brian Smith.
